Community Quilts News - April 2023

We had a very successful fabric sale in February! We made over \$800 – thanks to the donations of fabric, kits and other miscellaneous items. Community Quits will use the money to purchase batting and materials for making labels. Thank you to those generous folks who gave us items to sell and all those shoppers!

Another 30 breast cancer comfort kits went off to our local hospital in March. There are some kits for these available in a marked basket in the hall storage room.

Here are some more organizations that we donate to:

Quilts for seniors

Last year Community Quilts donated 44 quilts to The Views and Cumberland Lodge. These quilts are usually given to new residents to as a welcome to their new home. The quilts remain with the residents and are passed on to their families. These are smaller sized quilts to be used as lap quilts, either on beds, chairs or wheelchairs. Last year we also donated a Christmas quilt to Cumberland Lodge to use as part of their Christmas decorations.

Quilts of Valour - is a nationwide organization that we donate quilts to.

The Quilts of Valour – Canada Society has presented quilts to thousands of recipients who are coping with injuries both visible and invisible. These quilts are made by volunteer quilters from across the country who wished to show their appreciation to our injured Canadian Armed Forces members, past and present for their bravery and commitment to Canada and its citizens. The quilts come from individuals, groups and guilds, men and women, young people, retired armed forces members themselves and many others with no connection to the military.

All of the quilts that we give them are donated to recipients in the Comox Valley or Northern Vancouver Island. Community Quilts do not decide who to give these quilts to. Nominations are given to Quilts of Valour organization and they determine who receives them. Last year we donated 6 Quilts of Valour. If you are interested in making one of these, please check out the Quilts of Valour website (www.quiltsofvalour.ca) for size requirements and pattern suggestions. Generally these are larger quilts, 60"x80". Backing, batting are available for these quilts, and there is a long armer who quilts them – so all that you need to do is make a flimsy. Nerissa Thomas is the Comox/Northern Vancouver Island representative for Quilts of Valour, so if you would like more information or would like to make one, please contact her. She has recently presented 2 quilts to WW 2 veterans – one 97 and one 95.

Suggested Sizes for Community Quilts

Seniors (The Views) 40" x 50" or 45" square

Adult lap (Lilli House) 45" x 60"

Children' 40" x 50"

Quilts of Valour 60" x 80"

Senior Quilts – are a smaller size because they are easier to use with a wheelchair, and are given to women and men.

Transition Society (Lilli House) – mostly young women with children of all ages. **Quilts of Valour** – please check with quiltsofvalour.ca website for suggestions

We have quilts that we could raffle - the only problem being I will be out of town from May 28 until the end of June. It is our 50th wedding anniversary in June and we are planning a trip. I need somebody (or 2 people) to take over the raffle. I can arrange for the gaming licence and get the tickets printed; by I will need someone to help with:

- setting up the quilts to be raffled

CAMP HOMEWOOD RETREAT October 18th to 22nd 2023

This will be a **four** day retreat which provides us with lots of valued time for sewing and socializing.

Please note this retreat will run from 11am Wednesday to 11am Sunday.

The cost per individual for the **four** days will range from \$352. to \$445., depending on the room you choose.

Please note there has been a 10% increase on daily rates.

The starting range of \$352 includes the three non-updated private rooms in the guesthouse, as well as bunk style dorm rooms in the main lodge which sleep up to 7. However on average there are usually anywhere from 2 to 5 in these rooms.

Individuals in these rooms have shared bathroom/shower facilities. There is a separate handicapped washroom available to any that may require ease of access to toilet or shower.

There are also newer rooms available which sleep up to 3 and have their own washroom, including shower/tub. The cost of these rooms per person will depend on how many are sharing.

All prices include 3 meals a day, along with snacks in the evening consisting of cookies/squares, fruit, coffee, tea, and hot chocolate.

The meals at Camp Homewood are plentiful, with lots of selections at each meal . . . you will never walk away hungry!

If you have never been to a retreat at Camp Homewood we urge you to give it a try. It is a lot of fun and a great way to get to know your fellow

Sullivans Dry Silicone Spray from Fabricland

Tips for using Metallic Thread by Karen:

I used "Glitter" by Superior Threads" a flat hologram Mylar thread (4 ply film) with incredible sparkle. Made from metalized polyester similar to a Mylar balloon.

- Used for quilting, embroidery and decorative stitches.
- There are 24 colours with 400 meters on each spool.
- washer, dryer safe and medium iron temperature safe.
- home machine 90\14 needle and top tension 1.0
- placing the thread holder 2-3 feet from machine allows the thread to unwind.
- used Dry Silicone Spray on spool, bobbin and needle to eliminate skipped stitches and reduce thread breakage. It drys quickly and does not stain.
- I used regular cotton/poly thread in bobbin






Stash-Buster Quilts

mendous work she has done by teaching, judging shows and writing many books, Lynne, in 2008 received an MBE 'for service to arts and crafts'. Interesting that this award was presented by the Prince of Wales (King Charles III) who collects old Welsh quilts!

Stash - Buster Quilts main emphasis is on using some of your fabric stash as quickly and easily as possible. Be sure it is an enjoyable experience! Throughout the book there are time saving techniques shown by the use of an hourglass with a stop symbol printed on it. Picture of sewing shears next to cutting or stitching information draws your attention to extra advice, reflecting the experience of the designer and again, helpful when saving time and effort.

The 20 projects range in size from full size scrap quilts to stuffed pigs. Several variations of each project are often shown, giving a lot of ideas on use of color. Directions and diagrams are especially easy to follow, and a nice touch for each project is an explanation as to how and why this particular design came into being.

Following Lynne's directions, creating 'Corner Square' (pgs 84-89) is simply a matter of cutting on lines which look like they have been incorrectly places. Voila, not so! Making a number of 'Nine Patches'

is easy (pgs 92 - 93) following her instructions, and 'Ohio Star' (pgs 94-95) is just as easy. Some of these ideas need refreshing in our memories - likely a long time since we have seen a demo.

Enjoy Lynne's humor, too! When a bargello quilt was finished by a student, after many years, Lynne suggested it could be included in this book, 'if I could work out some instructions for it.' 'You should be able to', the student replied. 'It was a project in a magazine, and you wrote it'.
