

A Cozy Quilted Christmas

Kim Schaefer C&T Publishing 2007 Guild Library # 213

Christmas holidays will soon be upon us, and who is totally prepared? We have several Christmas themed books in our guild library, so search them out rather than pay for a new magazine! The book I have selected is a mix of wall/lap quilts, table runners and toppers as well as smaller, guick gift projects. All can



be done in no time with simple construction methods and be on the wall or table in no time.

'A Cozy Quilted Christmas' by Kim Schaefer, is a real gem. She begins with four lap quilt projects which combine simple piecing with fusible applique. In tune with the 'folk' look, there are no bright reds and greens, but more subtle, softer, more comfort-able colors. You will want to wrap yourself in these quilts! The smaller wall quilts are so varied, from an angel (halo included) wearing earmuffs and scarf, to one looking truly angelic in her striped socks. Don't limit yourself to a wall quilt - there are likely a dozen ways these adorable angels could be used!

A 'Poinsettia' or 'Tall Trees' table runner would fit in anywhere. Both are very Christmasy/wintery' even with the addition of turquoise in the border. What about using glitzy thread to outline the flowers? Wow! For around a small table top tree you have a choice of two different, but very attractive mini tree skirts. Finally, quick gifts perhaps most suited to men? Wool felt coasters, a snap to make, or what about Sport Santa Towels? Baseball Santa is ready to play, having his bat, ball and glove, even sporting a wonderful moustache. Again, as with the angels, I'm sure these fellows could be used in so many different ways. To complete the projects are mini freestanding Christmas trees - decorate with buttons, mini ornaments, what have you, and enjoy!

This book has fun - to - make, quick - to - make projects. The theme is Christmas, but with a folksy yet contemporary touch. Even if you don't make anything from this book, look at it and get your creative juices flowing!

Have you heard ???

President's Challenge this year is the "HST "

(half square triangle – one of the most common, most versatile quilt blocks). What is your favorite layout for these ? – stars ? chevrons ? flying geese ? – or are you ready to try some new layout ? Do you have a preferred method for trimming these to size ? Sometimes, the options seem unlimited.

To Enter this year's President Challenge :

Register with Gayle Hampton – cost is \$ 5.00. If you complete your project by June, your \$ 5. is returned - --- but, if you don't – the money goes to Community Quilts

Use your scrap HST's from previous projects – or make new ones

Any size project will be accepted – as long as the main focus is HST (although you can include other blocks in your layout)

The Library has many MANY books / patterns to provide options and ideas for you.

Books can be signed out for 1 month periods – if you need to keep it longer, then please return it to ensure no one else has requested it – and then sign it out again.

To request a book – there are small post-it notes on the cupboard door – write your name on it and then stick it to the card in the sign out book

If you return a book and find a request on your sign out card – please let the person waiting know that you've returned it.

1 tsp baking soda
1/2 tsp baking powder
