

### Big Print Patchwork - Quilt Patterns for Large Scale Prints

Sandy Turner Martingale 2013 Guild Library #495

Sandy Turner begins her introduction to this book with, "I love the fabric, but what do I do with it?" Good question, especially if you are looking at a beautiful large print, and can't imagine cutting it into small pieces. This book guides you through showcasing the "pictorial" prints by combining them with other fabrics and adding traditional block designs. The results are eye catching and likely appeal to both the traditional and more "modern" quilter.



A guide to choosing "pictorial" fabric is essential! These are the stars of your quilt and need to shine, while the other fabrics and pieced blocks work to enhance the pictures. A few guidelines such as considering scale, contrast and monotony of the design when choosing your fabric are included, along with photos which better explain what you are looking for in the "right" fabric.

Sandy has given instructions for three companion blocks (traditional

patterns) which she has used in the directions for making seven quilts. Don't be limited by these three, however, as thirteen more traditional block patterns are given at the end of the book.

When looking at the first project, "Snowy Slopes", note how the rail fence block helps guide the skier downhill! A large pictorial block can be used as the centre of a medallion style quilt - "Jungle Hooves" uses the Birds in the Air block as part of the surround. "Around the Orchard" relies on two pictorial fabrics surrounded by the Around the Twist block, resulting in a traditional quilt. For those who enjoy less symmetry in a quilt, see "Butterflies in the Moonlit Garden" or "Outside the fence". Applique and Broderie Perse are also used to add dimension to several of the quilts. The use of broderie Perse when adding hibiscus flowers over the Birds in the Air, page 57, give a feeling of flowers floating out of the quilt - very effective!

Good directions and diagrams, plus much additional information, make this book a winner. If you are still unsure about starting a President's Challenge project, take a look at this book. Half square triangles, used in the Birds in the Air block are the mainstay of (Continued on page 4)

"Jungle Hooves", "Feathered Friends" and "Butterflies in the Moonlit Garden". All three have excellent lists of materials, cutting directions and making the quilt instructions if you wish to make your own pictorial quilt - no more laments about loving your fabric and not knowing what to do with it!

Previously, we listed all the EQ (Electric Quilt) items – so those will not be repeated here.

One book is specifically about Needles and Thread -- **Book # 90** " **Point Well Taken** "

But most of the books in this section require a special ruler. A couple of years back, the President's Challenge was to create something with a ruler you had never used – and that list seems to be never ending. As we all know, Specialty Rulers can be pricey --- especially when we don't know whether we will ever use it for more than one project. I have found that over time, we have had a number of Specialty Rulers donated to our supply – and these can be found hanging on a wall in the storage room. Perhaps you will find one you might just want to 'play' with – so I have listed them below as well. **Have fun!**

### President's Challenge this year is the "HST "

(half square triangle – one of the most common, most versatile quilt blocks). What is your favorite layout for these ? – stars ? chevrons ? flying geese ? – or are you ready to try some new layout ? Do you have a preferred method for trimming these to size ? Sometimes, the options seem unlimited.

### To Enter this year's President Challenge :

*Register with Gayle Hampton – cost is \$ 5.00. If you complete your project by June, your \$ 5. is returned - --- but, if you don't – the money goes to Community Quilts* 

Use your scrap HST's from previous projects – or make new ones

Any size project will be accepted – as long as the main focus is HST (although you can include other blocks in your layout)
