Breast Cancer Comfort Kit - reminders

Thank you to everyone who has taken and made up the Breast Cancer Comfort bags and pillows. Just a few gentle reminders:

The ties on the bag must be attached on the **inside** of the bag - bag is used for holding ice packs over incisions and swelling, so the outside must be smooth.

The ties are placed on opposite sides of the bag opening.

They are ties, not straps, and need to be long. Please don't attach them more than 1 inch from the top of the bag.

The pillows should have 1/2 inch seams and please leave at least a 5 inch opening so they can be stuffed easily. Some people like to finish off the opening of the pillow - please don't as it makes it difficult to sew together.

Paper Piecing Demo by Judy

At 10 a.m. and at 6 p.m. on Wednesday, January 17, I, Judy Morrison, will be doing a paper piecing demonstration and each participant will make one block.

I will provide the pattern but each person should bring a 6" wof of blue or some other colour for sky, about a fat 1/8 of 3 different colours of green and a 6" square of brown.

Each participant needs a sewing machine with a neutral thread colour, a size 90 needle and the ability to have some fun. If you have an Add-a-quarter ruler that would be helpful but not necessary.

For those of you who want to join in at the last minute, I will have spare fabric for you to use.

CAMP HOMEWOOD RETREAT

February 21st– 25th, 2024. SIGN UP NOW!

Please sign up early as we will open to other guilds if not full by the beginning of January. This will be a *four* day retreat which provides us with lots of valued time for sewing and socializing.

Please note this retreat will run from 11am Wednesday to 11am Sunday.

The cost per individual for the *four* days will range from \$360. to \$454., depending on the room you choose. The starting range of \$360. includes the three non-updated private rooms in the guesthouse, as well as bunk style dorm rooms in the main lodge which sleep up to 7. However on average there are usually anywhere from 2 to 5 in these rooms. Individuals in these rooms have shared bathroom/shower facilities.

There is a separate handicapped washroom available to any that may require ease of access to toilet or shower. There are also newer rooms available which sleep up to 3 and have their own washroom, including show-tub. The cost of these rooms per person will depend on how many are sharing.

All prices include 3 meals a day, along with snacks in the evening consisting of cookies/squares, fruit, coffee, tea, and hot chocolate. The meals at Camp Homewood are plentiful, with lots of selections at each meal ... you will never walk away hungry!

If you have never been to a retreat at Camp Homewood we urge you to give it a try. It is a lot of fun and a great way to get to know your fellow quilters.

In the last few years we have seen a number of quilters who have attended retreat for the first time, and we continue to see more of them becoming regulars.
