We are <u>needing input</u> from the membership. We are looking for more ideas for our Thursday demos. Do you know a technique or idea that you use frequently that would benefit members? Not only do we need these ideas, <u>we need presenters</u>! Our membership is a huge resource we have barely tapped. Please consider approaching us to offer your expertise as others have done.

March 13 – Carol Metner – Carol used a unique **Double diamond ruler** to create a stunning embellishment in the border of the quilt that she donated to the raffle quilts at our last quilt show. Several people remarked about this feature. Come learn how it is done. If you don't have this ruler, no problem because it will be donated, and stored at the guild.

April 10 – Raelene Robertson – **QAYG or Quilt as you go**. We all know how difficult it is to quilt large items under the arm of our domestic machine.

Instead, quilt small sections of your project and join them using a method Sharon Pederson uses in her Reversible Quilts book. You may have used this method before. Come see how easy it is to plan out your sections, join blocks by machine or hand, and complete your quilt, start to finish!

GRANDMA'S SHORTBREAD RECIPE

Ingredients

- 1/2cup cornstarch
- 1/2cup icing sugar (confectioner's sugar, in Canada it's 'icing')
- 1cup all-purpose flour
- 3/4cup unsalted butter, softened (= 1 1/2 sticks, no margarine or substitute

Directions

- Sift together corn starch, icing sugar and flour.
- With wooden spoon (or by hand as I do it), blend in butter until soft, smooth dough forms.
- Shape into 1 inch (2.5 cm) balls.
- Place 1 1/2 inches (4 cm) apart on an ungreased cookie sheet, flatten with lightly floured fork.
- Alternatively, roll dough to 1/4 inch (6 mm); cut into shapes with cookie cutters.
- Decorate with candied cherries, colored sprinkles or nuts if desired.
- Bake in 300 Fahrenheit oven for 15-20 minutes or until edges are lightly browned.
- Cool on wire rack.

To make Crescents:

- Add 1/2 cup (125 ml) ground almonds or hazelnuts to flour mixture.
- Shape into logs about 1/2 inch (1 cm) thick and 3 inches (7 cm) long.
- Twist into crescent shapes.
- When baked and cool, dip ends in melted chocolate.

Newsletter Article - Community Quilts - for March 2025 newsletter

Schoolhouse Quilters' Guild maintains an active Community Quilts Program and supports a wide variety of people in need in this community.. This ranges (but is not limited to) from quilts that are used in Fund Raiser raffles for groups such as Y.A.N.A., Hospice, MARS --- Breast Cancer Comfort Bags for our hospital to provide to patients baby and toddler quilts for Health Unit and Teddies & Toddler Programs at both Vanier and Lake Trail Schools. Seniors at both Cumberland Lodge and The Views Men's Support Group Stepping Stone And no doubt I have left some off this list.

Although there is one volunteer (Diane Cave) who acts as Coordinator for Community Quilts – in truth this program requires support of many members of the Guild in order to run well --- as the saying goes "It Takes a Village to ~~~~~ "

There are a variety of ways a Guild member can become involved with / support our Community Quilts Program ~~ if you feel you can help in any of these areas (or have some other suggestions) – please speak with Diane, who is working to cover all the bases.

- Be a contact for a community group deliver quilts as necessary
- Help with organization of fabrics in the storage room
- Make up quilt kits and / or breast cancer kits
- Write up newsletter articles
- Willing to do quilting, binding or sewing on of labels to complete project
- Sewing of quilts / breast cancer bags
- Sew small items that can be sold at Craft Fair under Community Quilts name (which helps to raise funds to purchase batting, stuffing for breast cancer bags

 – as well as some fabrics for backing and sewing fabrics, tools, etc)
- Participating in fund raising events (selling raffle tickets, manning a booth, etc.
- Arrange to host one of the "Bee Block" projects (approximately once per month someone arranges a specific block / cuts fabrics for members attending that day can elect to sew one or two blocks for a quilt that is a group project
- Sew one or two blocks at one of the Bee Block days
- Sometimes, a flimsy is completed and donated to Community Quilts who then needs to arrange for completion choosing a backing – making a sandwich – quilting of this quilt – binding of the quilt – sewing on the label. These steps are usually done by several volunteers – so if you can fill one of these steps – let Diane know that she can call on you when necessary.

Have you heard ???

President's Challenge this year is the "HST"

(half square triangle – one of the most common, most versatile quilt blocks). What is your favorite layout for these? – stars? chevrons? flying geese? – or are you ready to try some new layout? Do you have a preferred method for trimming these to size? Sometimes, the options seem unlimited.

To Enter this year's President Challenge:

Register with Gayle Hampton – cost is \$ 5.00. If you complete your project by June, your \$ 5. is returned - --- but, if you don't – the money goes to Community Quilts

Use your scrap HST's from previous projects – or make new ones

Any size project will be accepted – as long as the main focus is HST (although you can include other blocks in your layout)

The Library has many MANY books / patterns to provide options and ideas for you.

Books can be signed out for 1 month periods – if you need to keep it longer, then please return it to ensure no one else has requested it – and then sign it out again.

To request a book – there are small post-it notes on the cupboard door – write your name on it and then stick it to the card in the sign out book

If you return a book and find a request on your sign out card – please let the person waiting know that you've returned it.

If you don't know how to sign books in / out of Library, just ask another Guild member of the process.

If you can't make it to the meeting it's best to mail it in to


