It has been a big job, but the library update work has now been completed and you are encouraged to check out all the available resources. To re-vitalize the library, many old books that were outdated and had not been taken out in several years have been removed (195 books to be precise) – this allows room for newer and more relevant materials. We have already added 40 new

books for you to explore and no doubt will have more to add as time passes. We still have 500 books to tempt you. All books have been assigned to a Category (subject matter) to assist you - we have 24 categories at this point (such as Applique - Art Quilts - Beginner Quilting, - Babies & Children - Scrap Quilts - special techniques - and many others). Thanks to Lois who provides an in-depth look at a specific book in each newsletter.

The Webpage also has a Library Section – under "Members Only"- where you will find a complete listing of all the books – sorted by number / by title / by author / by subject matter to help you find what you are interested in. Paper copies of these same sorted lists are available in duo-tangs in the Library at the Hall.

Don't know how to sign out a book? Consult the lists mentioned above in order to know what number the book is --- the books are in numerical order - find the book you want. If you wish to check out the book – remove the card in the book – date and sign it – and then place the card in the large binder... this is like a photo album binder and has pockets which are labeled with number & name of each book. Put the signed card in the correct pocket. When you return the book - just find your book's card again date and initial that the book is returned – put the card back in the book and put the book back on the shelf. If you need assistance, ask one of the Guild Members to show you.

Is there a subject matter – or a book you would like to see the Library obtain? There is a sheet on the inside of the cupboard door where you can request the book be obtained. If you have a book at home that you would like to donate to the Library please see Diane Cave or Susan Tutt.


#### Contact Us

### **Workshop news**

We hope you have been busy and seeing new things that you might like to learn or try.

I know this sounds like a broken record from us, but we are again requesting ideas and instructors, not only for workshops, but also our mini demo/workshops that we plan to hold on the second Thursday of each month. We have so much talent and experience, that we owe it to ourselves to tap this resource! <u>Talk to members and encourage them to do a demo</u>. These need not be project driven but may detail techniques and tips that someone has learned that you do not find in our books.

To this end, I will be doing a presentation on the use of **Golden Threads paper**. Basically, I use this as <u>an alternative way to mark designs</u> that I want to quilt several times on a project. This may be about 30 minutes give or take. No registration, fee or commitment. Just a willingness to learn something new. Date is Thursday, September 14. I shall be offering it at 10 am and 7 pm.

## Community Quilts News -September 2023

Community Quilts has had a relatively quiet summer, although quilts are being made and stored, waiting to be delivered later in the fall.

Four quilts were given to the WeCan Shelter Society in August. The Society builds homes out of shipping containers that are then located at the Maple Pool Campground. These become homes for some in our community who were previously unhoused.

There is a new roll of batting in the storage room for Community Quilt projects, and 2 more rolls have been ordered.

Thirty Breast Cancer Comfort Kits were sent to our local hospital in July. We often receive thank you notes from women who received them. All are very moving, but a recent one that I received in July really made it clear to me why we do this:

#### Schoolhouse Quilters

I don't think that I can adequately describe how much the recovery pillow means to me., but I'll try. In a moment of extreme vulnerability and fear, someone handed me this gift – I immediately took it out of its bag and clung to it like a child with a stuffed toy. It soothed me, comforted me, hid my face while I waited alone in the pre-op area for hours, and the gesture and care made me feel supported. Subsequently, it gave me comfort for many days, as I recovered. A true gift of (literal) support. Your talents and skill as crafters and artists shines through, and your dedication to this very worthy endeavour will never be forgotten by me.

Breast Cancer Comfort Kits are made throughout the year – we donate 120 kits each year. Kits are available in a basket in the storeroom – the kits contain all the materials needed as well as instruction. Additional kits will be made available later in September to those who would like to take them as one of their retreat projects.

# CAMP HOMEWOOD RETREAT October 18<sup>th</sup> – 22<sup>nd</sup>, 2023

## Lots of good beds left. Please sign up now.

The cost per individual for the *four* days will range from \$340. to \$432., depending on the room you choose. These rates are currently an approximation as there is generally a rate increase each year starting with the October retreat. The starting range includes the three non-updated private rooms in the guesthouse, as well as bunk style dorm rooms in the main lodge which sleep up to 7. However on average there are usually anywhere from 2 to 5 in these rooms. Individuals in these rooms have shared bathroom/shower facilities. There is a separate handicapped washroom available to any that may require ease of access to toilet or shower. There are also newer rooms available which sleep up to 3 and have their own washroom, including shower/tub. The cost of these rooms per person will depend on how many are sharing. All prices include 3 meals a day, along with snacks in the evening consisting of cookies/squares, fruit, coffee, tea, and hot chocolate. The meals at Camp Homewood are plentiful, with lots of selections at each meal . . . you will never walk away hungry!

If you have never been to a retreat at Camp Homewood we urge you to give it a try. It is a lot of fun and a great way to get to know your fellow quilters. In the past we have seen a number of quilters who have attended retreat for the first time, and we continue to see more of them becoming regulars. If you wish to sign-up or for further information please contact one of the retreat coordinators listed below. Our contact details can be located on the guild website under "retreats" or by viewing the membership list.

A \$50 deposit is required upon registration with the balance due the beginning of October. We look forward to seeing all of our regulars as well as some first timers for the upcoming retreats. For those of you that plan ahead the spring retreat is booked for February 21<sup>st</sup> to 25<sup>th</sup>, 2024.


